





We come in many shapes, sizes, and colors.




So do we.

I happen to be a Rhode Island Red.










My home is a wooden bin.





My nest is made of cozy straw.




I cuddle into strips of moist newspaper.














Chickens have no teeth. Our food is stored in our crops and chopped up in our gizzards.

## We eat






. . . yes, yes, yes, yes, yes, yes, . . . AND tea bags and coffee grounds.


